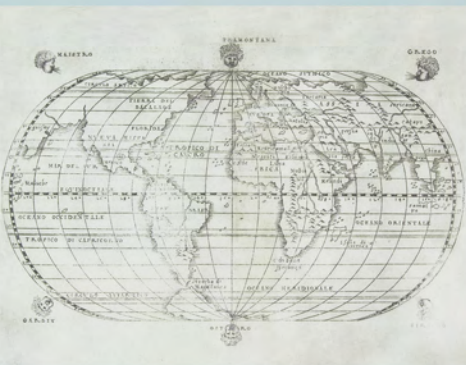

James L. Gutmann, DDS, PhD(honoris causa), FICD, FACD, FADI (USA)

Dr. Gutmann is Professor Emeritus, Baylor College of Dentistry, Texas A&M University Health Science Center, Dallas, Texas. He studied dentistry at the Marquette University School of Dentistry and received his specialty training in endodontics at the University of Illinois College of Dentistry in Chicago. Dr. Gutmann served in the U.S. Army Dental Corps for two years. He is a past president of the American Association of Endodontics, Diplomate of American Board of Endodontics, as well as the past chairman of the Department of Endodontics at Baylor College of Dentistry. Dr. Gutmann has authored three text books and numerous articles on endodontics. He has lectured extensively in 51 countries around the world.

Topic: Biologic perspectives on the road less traveled



Charles J. Goodacre, DDS, MSD (USA)

Dr. Goodacre received his DDS degree from Loma Linda University School of Dentistry in 1971. He completed a three year combined program in Prosthodontics and Dental Materials at Indiana University School of Dentistry and in 1974 earned his MSD degree. He began full-time teaching at Indiana University School of Dentistry in 1974 and has received awards from senior dental classes as the outstanding clinical instructor and lecturer. He served as Chairman of the Department of Prosthodontics at Indiana University, and currently is Dean of the Loma Linda University School of Dentistry. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics, Past-President of the American Board of Prosthodontics, a Fellow of the Academy of Prosthodontists, Fellow of the American College of Prosthodontists, and holds membership in the American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics. He was co-author of the 4th edition of the textbook, *Johnston's Modern Practice in Fixed Prosthodontics*, and served as an Editor of the *International Journal of Prosthodontics*.

James Bahcall, DMD, MS (USA)

Dr. Bahcall is an Associate Professor and Director of the Postgraduate Endodontic Residency Program at Marquette University School of Dentistry. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics and a Fellow in both the International and American College of Dentists. He has pioneered and is a leading authority on fiber optic and endoscopic visualization in the field of endodontics. Dr. Bahcall has also co-pioneered polymer-based abrasive rotary files and ultrasonic tips. He has been the recipient of outstanding teaching awards and has published numerous scientific articles, as well as written chapters for endodontic textbooks. He serves as a member of the Scientific Advisory Boards of the *Journal of Endodontics*, *Journal of Maxillofacial & Oral Surgery* and *Lasers in Surgery and Medicine*. Dr. Bahcall lectures on endodontics both nationally and internationally.

Topic: Integrating polymer-based abrasive rotary files and ultrasonic tips into your conventional endodontic treatment



Robert A. Handysides, DDS (USA)

Dr. Handysides is an associate professor and chair of the department of endodontics at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry. He received his D.D.S. degree from Loma Linda University in 1993 and a certificate in endodontics in 2001. Dr. Handysides was in private practice for 6 years in Kingston, Ontario, Canada prior to returning to Loma Linda for the post doctoral endodontic residency program. Upon completion of the residency program in 2001, he stayed on at Loma Linda in a full time capacity to pursue his interest in dental education. Dr. Handysides is a diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics. He teaches both didactically and clinically and actively participates in endodontic patient care.

Bertrand Khayat, DDS, MSD (France)

Dr. Khayat graduated from the University of Paris in 1982 and obtained his certificate in endodontics and his master of science in dentistry from the University of Washington in 1987. He maintains a private practice limited to endodontics. Dr. Khayat has lectured extensively both nationally and internationally. He is also widely published and an active member of many international endodontic societies and associations. He maintains a private practice limited to endodontics in Paris, France.

Topic: A new vision of endodontic surgery



Robert Love, BDS, MDS, PhD, FRACDS (New Zealand)

Dr. Love is Head of the Department of Oral Diagnostic and Surgical Sciences, and Head of the Endodontic Discipline at the University of Otago School of Dentistry. He practices and teaches endodontics and is actively involved in endodontic research. He has published extensively with his main area of research being the mechanisms involved in bacterial invasion of dentine. He has been involved in numerous professional organizations including President and Editor NZ Endodontic Society, President NZ Section NZ Division IADR, President Otago Branch NZ Dental Association, and Councillor Asia Pacific Endodontic Confederation. He previously held the position of Scientific Editor of the NZ Dental Journal, and is on the Editorial Boards of Dental Traumatology, International Endodontic Journal, European Journal of Dentistry, and Scientific Boards of the Journal of Endodontics and the Australian Endodontic Journal. Dr. Love is Chair of the Dental Council of New Zealand and has lectured and presented courses in New Zealand, Australia, Asia, USA, and Europe.

Topic: The effect of bioactive molecules in preventing bacterial invasion of dentin



Christine Sedgley, BDS, MDS, MDSc, FRACDS, MRACDS, PhD (USA)

Dr. Sedgley is Associate Professor and Chair, Department of Endodontology at the Oregon Health and Sciences University, and former Assistant Professor at the University of Michigan. She has participated in approximately 90 continuing education and research presentations. Her research interests include endodontic microbiology and root canal disinfection. Dr. Sedgley has published more than 50 papers and abstracts, authored the microbial virulence chapter in the *Endodontic Microbiology* textbook and co-authored the Endodontic Microbiology chapter in *Ingle's Endodontics*. She serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Endodontics*, *International Endodontic Journal*, *Brazilian Oral Health* and *ENDO Endodontic Practice Today*. Dr. Sedgley has lectured extensively both nationally and internationally.

Topic: Endodontic irrigation - clinical and biological aspects



James D. Johnson, DDS, MS, FICD (USA)

Dr. Johnson is Chair of the Department of Endodontics at the University of Washington School of Dentistry. He serves as the Program Director of the Advanced Specialty Education Program in Endodontics at the University of Washington. Dr. Johnson retired from the U.S. Navy Dental Corps in 2003 at the rank of Captain. He is a former Specialty Leader for Endodontics, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery to the Surgeon General of the Navy. He was Chairman of the Endodontic Department and Director of the Advanced Specialty Education Program in Endodontics at the Naval Postgraduate Dental School, and Chair of the Research Department at the Naval Postgraduate Dental School in Bethesda, Maryland. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics, and is a Director of the American Board of Endodontics. He has published many scientific articles and has authored a chapter in the 6th edition of *Ingle's Endodontics*. Dr. Johnson has lectured both nationally and internationally.
