Jørgen Slots, DDS, DMD, PhD, MS, MBA (USA)

Dr. Slots is Professor of Dentistry and Microbiology at the Ostrow School of Dentistry of USC. He graduated from the Royal Dental College, Copenhagen, Denmark in 1969. In 1976 he completed his Postgraduate Education in Periodontology at the Royal Dental College in Copenhagen, and in 1977 obtained a Certificate in Microbiology from the Forsyth Dental Center, Boston, MA. He obtained a D.M.D. degree in 1987 and an M.B.A degree in 1989 from the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Slots has served as Chair of the Dept. of Oral Microbiology at the University of Goteborg in Sweden (1982-1986), Chair of Periodontology at the Ostrow School of Dentistry of USC (1991-2001) and Associate Dean for Research (1990-2000). Since 1991 he has served as Head of the Oral Microbiology Testing Laboratory.

Topic: Infectious etiopathogenesis of periapical lesions: The missing link.



Anil Kishen, BDS, MDS, PhD (CANADA)

Dr. Kishen graduated with a BDS from the Univ. of Madras, and a MDS in Endodontics & Operative Dentistry from the Tamilnadu Medical University, Madras, India. He subsequently received his PhD in Biomedical Engineering from the Nanyang Technological University, Singapore. In 2003, he joined the National Univ. of Singapore as an Assistant Professor and was later promoted as a Tenured Associate Professor in the Department of Restorative Dentistry. In 2009 he moved to the Univ. of Toronto in Canada, where he is currently a Tenured Associate Professor in the Discipline of Endodontics. He has published over 100 peer-reviewed publications, and is a co-inventor in 4 patents. He has presented over 60 invited lectures world-wide. He is a recipient of many awards and honors including, The Enterprise Challenge Innovator Award in Singapore. He has published 11 book chapters and has co-edited two books. He serves as an Associate Editor for the Journal of Endodontics, Endodontic Topics and BMC Microbiology.

Topic: Microbiological and mechanical issues in endodontically treated teeth: Nanotechnology solution to old problems.



Donna Mattscheck, DMD (USA)

Dr. Mattscheck received her D.M.D. from the University of Kentucky in 1992. She completed a GPR at Northwestern Memorial Hospital and a Fellowship in Orofacial Pain at the University of Kentucky. She received her certificate in endodontics from the University of Iowa in 1996 and has been a diplomate of the ABE since 2000. She served as pre-doctoral director of endodontics at the University of Minnesota for eight years. In 2001 she received the Osetek young educator Award. Committee work includes the Educational Affairs and Regenerative Endodontics and as well as others. Additionally, she served as treasurer of the AAE Foundation and their liaison to the Research and Scientific Affairs committee as well as chair of their student ambassador program. Dr. Mattscheck currently is a Director of the American Board of Endodontics, the only certifying board for the specialty of endodontics. She has given numerous invited presentations both here and abroad and has co-authored a chapter in *Pathways of the Pulp*. She joined Advanced Endodontics in Tigard, Oregon in the fall of 2010.

Topic: Diagnosing non-odontogenic toothaches.



Christine I. Peters, DDS, Dr.med.dent. (USA)

Dr. Peters received her degree in dentistry from the University of Heidelberg, Germany, in 1992. She served as an assistant professor in the Department of Prosthetic Dentistry from 1992 till 1996. Christine then worked in the Division of Endodontics at University of Zurich, Dental school from 1997 till 2004 and completed her postgraduate endodontic training in 2001. She filled a two-year position at the University of the Pacific in San Francisco from 2001 till 2003. Since 2004 she has resumed her status at the Department of Endodontics, University of the Pacific, Dental School, as Associate Professor. Christine Peters teaches and lectures in the endodontic field, directs CE courses and participates in faculty practice. Dr. Peters has published in peer-reviewed journals and lectured both nationally and internationally. She serves on the review panel of several endodontic journals, including the Journal of Endodontics and the International Endodontic Journal, and is past president of the Northern Californian Academy of endodontics.

Topic: Soft tissue management in endodontic surgery.



Mahmoud Torabinejad DMD, MSD, PhD (USA)

Dr. Torabinejad is a Professor of Endodontics and Director of Graduate Endodontics at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry in Loma Linda, California. Dr. Torabinejad is the highest cited researcher in the field of endodontics and has made over 200 national and international presentations in more than 40 countries. In addition to co-authoring three textbooks in non-surgical and surgical endodontics as well as implant dentistry, he has authored over 300 publications on various endodontic and dental topics. He is a Past President of the American Association of Endodontists.

Topic: Management of teeth with necrotic pulp and open apices.



Patrick Bogaerts, DDS (BELGIUM)

Dr. Bogaerts graduated from the Catholic University of Louvain in 1980. In 1988 he earned the Certificate in Endodontics from the French Endodontic Society with Professor Jean-Marie Laurichesse. After a mini residency in the Endodontic Department of the Veterans' Administration Hospital, Long Beach (California), with Professor James H.S. Simon in 1992, he started the first private practice limited to Endodontics in Belgium. In 1997 and 1998, he participated in the School of Dental Medicine, University of Pittsburgh, with Dr. James A. Wallace for training in Surgical Endodontics. He has been the President of the International Federation of Endodontic Associations (IFEA) since April 2012. Several of his works have been published in French, Dutch, German and English literature.

Topic: Endodontic retreatment: How far can we go?



Alan H. Gluskin, DDS (USA)

Dr. Gluskin graduated from the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry, San Francisco, California in 1972. He received his Endodontic Certification from Temple University in Philadelphia in 1976. Dr. Gluskin is currently Professor and Chairperson, Department of Endodontics, Arthur A. Dugoni School of Dentistry, University of the Pacific in San Francisco, California. He is at present a Fellow of the International College of Dentists and the American College of Dentists. Dr. Gluskin is a member of numerous societies including the American Association of Endodontists, the American Dental Association and the San Francisco Dental Society. He is currently serving as a District VII Director on the Board of the American Association of Endodontists. He presently serves on the editorial boards of the Journal of Endodontics and the International Journal of Endodontics. He is co-editor of the textbooks *Decision Making in Dental Treatment Planning* and *Practical Lessons in Endodontic Treatment*.

Topic: What's left when the endo is done?



George Bogen, DDS (USA)

Dr. Bogen maintains a private endodontic practice in Los Angeles, California. Dr. Bogen received his dental degree in 1978 and his certificate in endodontics in 1995, both from USC. He lectures for the postgraduate departments at UCLA, NOVA University, Loma Linda and the VA in Long Beach and is a former Clinical Assistant Professor of Endodontics at USC. He is the Past President of the Southern California Academy of Endodontists, Past Secretary and Trustee of the American Association of Endodontists Foundation, currently a member of the Scientific Advisory Board for the Journal of Endodontics and the International Endodontic Journal, past member of the AAE Corporate Relations Committee and a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics. He served as the staff endodontist for the Dental Clinic at the USC/LAC Medical Center in Los Angeles and has served since 1998 as the chief endodontic provider for the Children's Dental Health Clinic at the Long Beach Memorial Children's Hospital. Dr. Bogen has published numerous research articles, textbook chapters and has lectured nationally and internationally.
