Gerald N. Glickman, DDS, MS (USA)

Professor and Chair of the Department of Endodontics and Director of Graduate Endodontics at Texas A & M University/Baylor College of Dentistry in Dallas. He received an M.S. degree in Microbiology from the University of Kentucky, a D.D.S. from the Ohio State University, a G.P.R. Certificate from the University of Florida, a Certificate and M.S. in Endodontics from Northwestern University, an M.B.A. from Southern Methodist University, and a J.D. from Texas Wesleyan University. Dr. Glickman is currently President of the American Association of Endodontists and is Past-President of the American Board of Endodontics. He is Chair of ADEA's Council of Sections Task Force on Competencies and Foundation Knowledge for the New General Dentist and a Fellow of both the American College of Dentists and the International College of Dentists. He serves on the editorial boards of the International Endodontic Journal; Oral Surgery, Oral Medicine, Oral Pathology, Radiology, and Endodontics; and is an Associate Editor of the Journal of Endodontics. Dr. Glickman has contributed to major texts in endodontics including the 9th ed. of *Pathways of the Pulp*, the new 4th ed. of *Principles and Practice of Endodontics*, and the new 6th edition of Ingle's *Endodontics*.

Bettina Basrani, DDS, Dip. Endo, PhD. (CANADA)

Assistant Professor and Co Director of the M.Sc. Endodontic Program at the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto. Dr. Basrani received her DDS degree from the University of Buenos Aires and a Diploma in Endodontics and PhD from Maimonides University in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Dr. Basrani is a member of many international endodontic societies and has international courses, lectures, articles, textbook chapters and abstracts to her credit.

John Stropko, DDS (USA)

Instructor of MicroSurgery at the Scottsdale Center for Dentistry, in Scottsdale, Arizona. He received his DDS from Indiana University in 1964. In 1989, he received a Certificate in Endodontics from Boston University and has recently retired from the private practice of endodontics in Scottsdale. Dr. Stropko is an internationally recognized authority on MicroEndodontics. He has been a visiting clinical instructor at PERF, an Adjunct Assistant Professor at Boston University and an Assistant Professor of Graduate Clinical Endodontics at Loma Linda University. Dr. Stropko is the inventor of the Stropko Irrigator, has published in numerous journals, and is an internationally known speaker. Along with Dr. Joseph Dovgan, is a co-founder of Clinical Endodontic Seminars.

Dag Ørstavik, DDS, PhD (NORWAY)

Professor and Head, Department of Endodontics at the Dental Faculty of the University of Oslo. He received his dental degree from the University of Oslo in 1969, PhD (dr. odont.) from the University of Oslo in 1977 and completed a specialization in endodontics at the University of Oslo in 1984. He has taught and practiced endodontics as a professor at the University of Oslo and as a visiting and adjunct professor at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and maintained a part-time private practice in Oslo. From 1978 to 2004, Dr. Ørstavik was a Senior Scientist at NIOM – The Scandinavian Institute of Dental Materials, where he worked with endodontic materials and ran clinical testing programs at the institute. Since 1996, he is Adjunct Professor at the Department of Endodontics, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Dr. Ørstavik is Treasurer of the European Society for Endodontology and Past President of the Norwegian Endodontic Society. He was Associate Editor of *Endodontics and Dental Traumatology*, and now serves on the editorial board of the *International Endodontic Journal* and is a co-editor of *Endodontic Topics*. He is also co-editor of the textbook *Essential Endodontology: Prevention and Treatment of Apical Periodontitis*.

Ove Peters, DDS, MS, PhD (USA)

Professor and Director of Endodontic Research in the Endodontic Department of the Arthur A. Dugoni School of Dentistry at the University of the Pacific, San Francisco and maintains a private practice in San Francisco. He received his degree in dentistry (Dr. med dent) from the University of Kiel, Germany, in 1990. After spending two years in the Department of Neurophysiology at the University of Kiel, he has served as an Assistant Professor of Prosthodontics at the University of Heidelberg, Germany, from 1993 to 1996. He received postgraduate endodontic training as well as a PhD (Dr. habil.) at Zurich University Dental School from 1997 to 2001. He was an Associate Professor and Head of the faculty practice in restorative dentistry at the University of Zurich from 1996 to 2001. Dr. Peters attended UC San Francisco from 2001 to 2003 and received an MS certificate in Oral Biology. He also received a certificate in endodontics from UCSF in 2006.

Ashraf F. Fouad, BDS, DDS, MS (USA)

Professor and Chairman, Department of Endodontics, Prosthodontics and Operative Dentistry at the University of Maryland. Dr. Fouad received his DDS and Certificate of Endodontics and Master of Science degree from the University of Iowa. He published over 100 manuscripts, research abstracts, and textbook chapters. He edited and co-authored the textbook *Endodontic Microbiology*. He is current member of the Board of Directors, American Board of Endodontics, and Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics.

Homayoun Zadeh, DDS, PhD (USA)

Associate Professor at the USC School of Dentistry and a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology. He received his doctor of dental surgery degree from USC School of Dentistry in 1987. He has also completed advanced clinical education in Periodontology and earned a PhD degree in immunology from the University of Connecticut, Schools of Dental Medicine and Medicine. Dr. Zadeh directs the Laboratory for Immunoregulation and Tissue Engineering (LITE), funded by the National Institutes of Health. He has extensive publication track record and serves as editorial reviewer for several scientific journals. He also serves on an advisory panel to the Center for Scientific Review of the National Institutes of Health. Dr. Zadeh is the Director of the USC Periodontal and Implant Symposium, and the USC Comprehensive Surgical and Restorative Implant Training Program. He also maintains a part-time private practice limited to Periodontology in Southern California.

He is currently a District Director for the 7th District (California) of the American Association of Endodontists and Past- President of the California State Association of Endodontists. Dr. Tsutsui is a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, International College of Dentists and Pierre Fauchard Academy and has lectured nationally and internationally.
