Dr. Sandra Madison is President of the American Association of Endodontics and in full-time private practice in Asheville, N.C. She received her M.P.H. and D.D.S. degrees from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and her M.S. and Certificate in Endodontics from the University of Iowa. She later was engaged for eleven years in full-time teaching at the University of Iowa and the University of North Carolina, where she is also currently a Clinical Associate Professor.

Dr. Madison has been an AAE member since 1979 and served as President-Elect of the Association from 2003-2004, Vice President from 2002-2003, and as Secretary from 2000-2002. She has also served on various committees, including the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, the Scientific Advisory Panel for the *Journal of Endodontics* and the Ad Hoc Committee on the Endodontic Educator Fellowship Award in 2003-2004 as chair. Dr. Madison served on the AAE Foundation Board of Trustees from 1987-1991 and was elected President from 1990-1991. She was later elected as Director of the American Board of Endodontics for two consecutive terms, serving as President of the Board during 1996-1997.

In addition to being active in the AAE and ADA, Dr. Madison has also been involved with other dental organizations, including the International Association for Dental Research, the University of North Carolina Dental Foundation, the American Dental Education Association, and the North Carolina Dental Society, where she served as First District President from 1999-2000. She is also Fellow of the American College of Dentists and the International College of Dentists and member of the dental honor society, Omicron Kappa Upsilon.

### Lecture Synopsis

This presentation overviews the issues facing the specialty of Endodontics presently and in the future. The potential impact of these issues on endodontists will be highlighted with an emphasis on the role of the American Association of Endodontists in addressing them. The future of our specialty relative to our responsiveness to the changing dynamics in dentistry will also be discussed.
